Dr Peter Manasa Mbizvo is a qualified medical doctor, businessman and entrepreneur.

The new initiative in Zimbabwe which is meant to be scaled throughout the major cities on a commercial level and spread to remote areas on a Corporate Social Responsibility is the Urgent Care Clinics.









He also gives food and clothes to people in the community and has assisted with giving food hand- outs to teachers at farm schools. He is involved in Corporate Social Responsibility at a personal level and also with different organisations where he serves as a trustee. In his individual capacity, he has given scholarships to students at different levels, from early learning to tertiary and some have become qualified medical doctors and other professionals. Due to his compassionate nature, he has dedicated his time and resources into ensuring that he assists children who come from disadvantaged backgrounds.



Peter is the Patron for the farming community clinic (Takunda Clinic) which was built by a South Korean donor organization which pulled out before the completion of the construction and refurbishment. He financed the electrification process of the clinic and currently supports with salaries for staff on a monthly basis. The clinic serves twenty-one (21) villages/ farms, three (3) primary schools and one (1) secondary school, and a police base in the catchment area.

 Hospitals Trust", which has been formed with the purpose of mobilising resources to
 assist all government hospitals which are suffering from an acute shortage of drugs,
 consumables, equipment and other necessities.




Peter was the Chairman for Celebration Health which is run by Celebration Ministries. He played a major role in providing medical counsel to doctors around the country, and sourcing as well as distributing medicine and other supplies to district and provincial hospitals. He also helped (through the Leap Foundation) in bringing in specialist surgical teams from the United States of America, who conducted free cleft lip operations around the country.



He was a trustee of the Tariro Halfway Home Rehabilitation Centre for psychiatric patients and he is a "friend" of an orphanage called Harare Children's Home. He has dedicated his life to continue carrying out charity work as a contribution to the welfare of the communities to the best of his ability both directly and indirectly.
